
the year 1836; it is twenty-eight feet by eighteen feet in the clear, ten feet high in the side walls, with thatch roof. It is one room, and is well filled with desks in excellent condition. Teacher, James Thompson, about thirty years of age. Sixty-eight children on an average daily attendance—females, twenty; males, forty-eight. It opens in summer at nine o'clock a.m., and continues till five p.m., with an interval of one hour for dinner. In winter it opens at ten o'clock, and continues till three o'clock; no interval. Both summer and winter it is held during six days of the week."

The rebuilding of Seymour's Bridge School-house in the year 1836 was carried out by Messrs. Andrew Picken, Hazelbank; John L. Holden, Kerrsbrook; James Davison, Ballytresna, &c., in whose charge the school-house had been placed, and they spared neither labour nor expense in the execution of the work.
